Unacceptable Paper - to be put in the regular trash dumpsters

- Paper soiled with grease, food, paint etc.
- Wax-coated paper
- Paper plates and cups
- Tissues, toilet paper, paper towels and napkins
- Paper items with layers of plastic or foil
- Hard covered books (remove the covers and/or metal spiral and recycle)
- Cat litter/Paper used for animal training or bedding
- Diapers/pull-ups

Unacceptable Items – to be put in regular trash dumpsters

- Pots, pans, bowls, utensils and other cookware
- Plastic/ceramic/china dinnerware
- Plastic buckets, planters, baskets and recycle bins
- Containers that held a hazardous material (oil, anti-freeze, pool and yard chemicals, spackle, oil-based paint etc.)
- Plastic bags (can be recycled at the Orange County Transfer Stations)
- Styrofoam cups, plates, bowls (styrofoam peanuts can be recycled at the Orange County Transfer Station in Goshen)
- Light bulbs (except fluorescent which should be brought to the Orange County transfer Station)
- Metal/plastic hangers
- Toys

Orange County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Orange County conducts a semi-annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day. Materials such as oil-based paint, pesticides, herbicides, corrosive cleaners, pool chemicals, oil-based paint, varnish/shellac/stains/wood preservatives/solvents/thinners, aerosol cans, photographic chemicals dry wall compound, automotive products, joint compound, rubber cement, roofing tar, driveway sealer, creosote, inks, adhesives, mercury and fluorescent light bulbs can be brought to a designated locations where hazardous materials will be categorized and disposed of at a hazardous waste facility. Additionally, tv sets and computer peripherals (computer monitors, laptop computers, keyboards, mouse, speakers, scanners, gaming controls and printers should be brought to Hazardous Waste Day.

Do Not Bring: Water based paints (expose them to air and let solidify. The solid can then be put in the household garbage. The can be rinsed and recycled). propane tanks/gas cylinders, tires, empty barrels, medical "sharps" (all medical sharps can be taken to your local hospital for safe disposal. All hospitals are required to take them.

Air Conditioners should be brought to the Orange County Transfer Station. The transfer station is open from Monday to Friday from 8am to 3pm and Saturday from 8am to 12 noon. There is a fee and they only take cash or a credit card.
